

# **Energy Financial Incentives for Pennsylvania Residents**

According to the U.S. Energy Information Administration, the average Pennsylvania family consumes more than 10,000 kilowatt-hours (kWh) of electricity annually and spends more than \$2,000 per year on energy bills. A homeowner can take steps to make their home more energy efficient at little or no cost. Some projects, such as lighting changes, require little financial investment. Other projects, such as insulation or improvements to heating and cooling systems, may require significant financial investment. This fact sheet describes some financial incentives that may be available to Pennsylvania residents who wish to save energy and money.

## Act 129 Electric Company Energy Efficiency Programs and Rebates

The PA Public Utility Commission (PUC) implements Act 129, which guides consumers and electric utilities toward achieving reduced energy consumption and peak electric demand. ## **Weatherization Assistance Program**

Pennsylvania's Weatherization Assistance Program strives to increase energy efficiency in low-income homes by reducing energy costs and increasing comfort while safeguarding health and safety. ## **Home Energy Efficiency Loan Program (HEELP)**

The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency's (PHFA) HEELP offers loans for specific energy efficiency repairs. Loans between \$1,000 and \$10,000 are offered at a fixed-rate of one percent (1 percent) for 10 years with no prepayment penalties. For more information about HEELP, click here.

## Federal Tax Credits for Consumer Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Products

### Alternative Fuel Vehicle (AFV) Rebate Program

## Plug-In Electric Drive Motor Vehicle Federal Tax Credit

A federal tax credit is available for the purchase of a new qualified plug-in electric drive motor vehicle that draws propulsion using a traction battery. Eligible vehicles must have a battery capacity of at least five kWh, use an external source of energy to recharge the battery, have a gross vehicle weight rating of up to 14,000 pounds, and meet specified emission standards.
